








Many women have to take on the double role as full-time workers and unpaid caregivers -because of social stereotypes, limited access to incentives & policies, and reduced time for education and training.






That is why the "Women Empowerment in Tech" Fundraising Campaign was created. More than tangible values, each contribution is a commitment that we believe in their potential.

Challenge

Moreover, gender equity in higher education remains a challenge for PNV. Women in Vietnam confront significant barriers to accessing higher education and well-paid employment opportunities.

To offer young women from underprivileged backgrounds an opportunity to build a career in the digital industry.

Objective

Raise funding to award full-ride scholarships to 3 female students, allowing them to pursue 1 year of IT education at PNV


